Likewise, if you move, change phone numbers or email address please let us know.



The mission of World Relief Quad Cities is to support immigrants in vulnerable situations as they rebuild their lives in the United States.

In the last 24 years, World Relief Quad Cities has resettled over 4,000 refugees. In partnership with the U.S. Department of State, World Relief supports refugees in the initial resettlement period - the first 90 days after arrival - helping secure housing, supplying basic necessities,

and enrolling children in school.

At World Relief Quad Cities, their goal is to see children and families flourish and reach their fullest potential, despite the early obstacles they face upon immigrating. Their Youth & Family Services actively prepare refugee and immigrant children for a successful school experience and long-term cognitive and socio-emotional development by working with them and their families.

Refugee families often flee their homes at a moment's notice and arrive at the airport with few belongings. You can support these families by donating household goods, furniture and other items to World Relief, Monday thru Friday, 9am to 4pm at 1852 16th Street Moline. 
This is a 12 session study and we studied lessons 1-6 last summer. This summer, we will finish the Book of Daniel with lessons 7-12.


