"He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?"

Micah 6:8

In a world where justice, love, kindness and humility are becoming more and more scarce, I keep coming back to this passage from the prophet Micah (above) and to the words of James found in chapter 2:14-26, and finally to worlds of Isaiah which Jesus declared as fulfilled in his calling (Luke 4:18-19) – a calling that he extended to his disciples before his ascension. In a world that desperately needs some justice, love, kindness and humility, it falls to all of us who claim to be followers of Jesus to provide these things. Which brings me back to a quote by author L.R. Knost that's been posted on my office door for several years now. In case you haven't seen it, here it is:

"Get up off of your knees. Come out of your churches, your mosques, your temples. God can hear your prayers for peace, justice and hope in this broken world just fine while you're out creating peace, working for justice and giving hope to this broken world. When are we finally going to realize that humanity is the solution to inhumanity? When will we finally understand that we are all drops of the same ocean, hurting together, healing together, hoping together? Don't just pray for hands to heal the hurting. Pray with hands that are healing the hurting. Don't just pray for arms to help the helpless. Pray with arms that are helping the helpless. Don't just pray for feet to respond to need. Pray on feet that are responding to need. Don't just pray for someone to do something. Be someone who does something. Don't just pray for answers. Be the answer."

More than ever, our world needs people of faith who are more interested in doing the good work of faith. Our call is not simply to believe in something, but to be co-creators in establishing something, and that something is the kingdom of God. May we be like our ancestor Isaiah, who when he heard God calling, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" responded, "Here am I; send me!" (Is.6:8).


# Notes from the June Session Meeting

Phishing is "the <u>fraudulent</u> practice of sending emails or other messages <u>purporting</u> to be from <u>reputable</u> companies (or persons) in order to induce individuals to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit card numbers."

staff asking for money, gift cards, "a discreet meeting," or anything like this, do not even open the email – delete it immediately! No one on staff would send such a note. This is good practice with any email that seems 'phishy' – and NEVER open attachments unless you are absolutely sure they are safe.

Likewise, if you move, change phone numbers or email address please let us know.


