Psalm 46:10

How do you "exalt" God? What does the exaltation of God mean to you? Is your exaltation of God more meaningful as a personal activity or when practiced in the community of faith?

For some of us, the praise and adoration of God comes more easily through music and song. For others it is more about quiet prayer and contemplation. For some, the vaulted glory of a gothic cathedral or the comfort of a home worship space evokes an upwelling of praise to God. For others, the vaulted glory of the mountains and the vastness of the sea draws out our exaltation of our Creator. For me personally, the glory of God's creation – mountains, sea and forest – has always elicited my praise and adoration.

To that end, I recently came across once again a poem by Mary Oliver that speaks to my heart and captures so well my thoughts when I find myself in God's glorious creation...

When I am Among the Trees By Mary Oliver

When I am among the trees, especially the willows and the honey locust, equally among the beech, the oaks and the pines, they give off such hints of gladness. I would almost say that they save me, and daily.

I am so distant from the hope of myself, in which I have goodness, and discernment, and never hurry through the world but walk slowly, and bow often.

Around me the trees stir in their leaves and call out, "Stay awhile." The light flows from their branches.

And they call again, "It's simple," they say, "and you too have come into the world to do this, to go easy, to be filled with light, and to shine."

I pray that you find the space in your life where the exaltation of God flows naturally from your heart. And I pray that you are able to visit the space often!

Phishing is "the <u>fraudulent</u> practice of sending emails or other messages <u>purporting</u> to be from <u>reputable</u> companies (or persons) in order to induce individuals to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit card numbers."

If you receive an email from anyone on the church

staff asking for money, gift cards, "a discreet meeting," or anything like this, do not even open the email — delete it immediately! No one on staff would send such a note. This is good practice with any email that seems 'phishy' — and NEVER open attachments unless you are absolutely sure they are safe.
